



remember stepping on the scale Jan. 1, 2001, only a few weeks after L delivering my first child. I had gained over 55 pounds and knew that weighing myself probably wasn't the best way to ring in the new year, but my irrational, hormonal self didn't care. As my poor husband tried to counsel me amidst all my sobs and swearing, I resolutely declared to lose the weight quickly and to return to my pre-pregnancy clothes within a month. I can honestly say without any exaggeration that my resolution was a complete bust, and my husband is still traumatized by that meltdown 16 years later.

They say that most New Year's resolutions are broken by Jan. 20, which challenges us with the question,

why do we drop the ball after the ball drops? For most (myself included), it begins with the resolution part, more specifically, the word, "resolution." It's harsh and unforgiving and it sets us up for failure. A resolution indicates a promise, a firm or determined course of action. Nevertheless, what happens if you're not feeling so firm or determined one day, or your hormones lead you on a four-day cookie bender? Does that mean your resolution is blown?

While it may sound counterintuitive, I encourage those I work with to use the phrase, "work-in- progress," in lieu of resolution, and in my experience, people are more receptive to this shift in attitude. Moreover, they have enjoyed far better results in their

health and fitness journeys because the concept of being a work-in-progress is a more realistic notion. It allows us to fully celebrate life's joys or deal with its letdowns without guilt, or feeling like failures. Of course, like anything else, change takes time. However, habits can take as little as 30-60 days to form and if started now, you could be in far better shape, both physically and emotionally, as the new year approaches.

Jan. 1 is an artificial timeline for most. In fact, I have seen people use this hyped-up deadline as carte blanche to overindulge so much throughout the holiday season, that by the time the ball drops, they are dealing with an extra 5-10 pounds. Next, they peter out after approximately two weeks by

either overexerting themselves in the gym to the point of pain, or resentfully restricting their diets too much. Does this sound familiar?

Here's how to begin. First, remove that looming, Jan. 1 target date from your calendar and start creating a work-in-progress list to replace your resolution line-up. The goal is to focus on action and accountability all throughout the

year as opposed to a deadline as your launching point. As you shift your mental focus and embrace the work-in-progress approach, you will find it is far easier to overcome unforeseen circumstances that may derail your health and fitness goals before, during and after the ball drops.

Below is a work-in-progress sample.

While the chart may appear a bit over

simplified, it nonetheless demonstrates unattainable resolutions versus work-in-progress goals. The act of successfully accomplishing our goals is rooted in our language, focus and attitude, so carefully compare those three components below. If the goal is impractical, then success will be too. Review your goals every two-weeks to tweak or re-adjust.

Unrealistic Resolutions	Work-in-Progress Goals
I will work out 6 days-a-week-starting Jan.1 and hit the gym hard.	I will aim for 2 hours a week and include some strength training when I'm ready. If I miss a workout, I'll try to do something active that day like walk the dog or play with my kids.
Lose 10 pounds in one month by restricting my diet.	I will start by eliminating some sweets and replace with fruit. I will aim for a 1-2-pound weight loss a week.
I will cut out all carbs for rapid weight loss.	I will start by swapping out some bad carbs for healthy carbs and adjust as I go along.
I have to eat more fibrous vegetables because they will fill me up and speed weight loss.	I will prepare an easy and enjoyable recipe for one new vegetable this month.
Cold turkey on wine!	I'm going to cut down wine to one time per week, and enjoy it in moderation at special occasions.
No more coffee.	Keep coffee, but cut from 3 cups to 1 cup (maybe start with two and see where it goes). Use one creamer instead of three.
If I mess up, I have to start all over again, and hit it even harder.	If I eat too much or miss too many workouts this week, I will get back on track.
Failure is not an option!	Progress is my only option.

The work-in-progress method is a far better way to start off your new year, and it doesn't have to stop with your nutrition or fitness goals either. In fact, it can be applied to any aspect of your professional or personal life. We can't always be the perfect parent (I know I'm not), employee, boss, coach or spouse, and yet many of us struggle with the notion that we should be

what I call "Pinterest Perfect." When we fall into this trap, our lives are anything but utopian.

Lastly, the concept of being a work-inprogress doesn't mean we shouldn't try to do our best, rather, it allows us the mental space to understand that we are entitled to make mistakes, learn from them and continually evolve as individuals. Treehouse Eyes

treatment for kids that can correct and then stop or slow the worsening of their nearsightedness? What?

No way, I had no idea this existed! Does this mean that I can save my daughter from what I experienced growing up, with progressively worse and worse vision (and thicker and thicker lenses)? She could play sports without glasses? Swim with great vision? See when she wakes up in the morning? Tell me more!

This is the rapid internal conversation I had when I learned about Treehouse Eyes from a Facebook post on a local news channel. After watching the segment, I jumped online and started researching. I learned that myopia (commonly known as nearsightedness) control methods have been around for a long time, and Treehouse Eyes was dedicated to solely using myopia control for children.

Our daughter had first started wearing glasses in first grade, and her vision was worsening. I knew eventually she would have a very strong prescription (like mom – sigh), and that for the rest of her life she would be stuck with glasses, contacts, LASIK surgery or all three. I contacted Treehouse Eyes immediately for a consultation, and good news for us – they had a location in Tysons Corner, VA.

From the first visit at Treehouse, our experience has been fabulous. Their office is decorated and appointed with a child in mind with games and toys in the lobby and a fun treehouse motif throughout the murals and décor.

We initially met with Dr. Andrew Morgenstern, who spent nearly two hours doing a detailed examination of my daughter's vision and eye health and answering our questions. He patiently entertained my older son's questions (he with the perfect vision) and projected the exam on a flat screen so we could see



everything he saw. In more than 35 years of my own eye exams, I've never seen such a thorough and knowledgeable exam and was very reassured that my daughter was in good hands.

A lot of the consultation was focused on my daughter's maturity at not-quite-8-years-old to handle and take care of the contact lenses she would wear to correct her myopia. We decided she was ready and got fitted for her first pair, which arrived in about a week.

I'll be honest that at first it wasn't so comfortable for her – they are gas permeable lenses that she sleeps in each night and removes each morning. Think of it like wearing a retainer for your teeth – each night the lens puts a slight bit of pressure on the cornea to reshape it (like pushing your teeth in place) so that when you take it out in the morning the eye has normal vision. Amazing! We had to use some techniques to motivate her (stickers, rewards and praise), but soon she got the hang of it and was putting them in herself.

And her vision without the lenses tested at 20/20 or very close. Wow again.

Right away we saw an improvement in her sports and her general confidence

at school. Although she thought her glasses were cool, it is obvious to us that the independence without them is worth it. And as parents we know that by making the commitment to myopia control, we are giving her options that we never had. The fact that we are able to give her perfect or near perfect vision without glasses or lenses and stop her vision from getting worse means that when she is an adult she will have different options than we had.

If your child is diagnosed with myopia, I strongly recommend you schedule an evaluation at Treehouse Eyes to discuss their myopia control program. It's already made a huge difference in my daughter's quality of life.







A few simple winterizing tips for the outside and inside of your car can ensure you're ready to take the road by storm this winter, wherever your adventures may lead.

OUTSIDE



Inspect your headlights and brake lights to ensure they're fully functioning, which is especially important during winter fogs or heavy snow.



WINDSHIFI D **WIPERS**

Buy washer fluid with antifreeze solution to protect visibility and ensure windshield blades are in good working order.



Don't forget a winter coat - of wax, that is! A fresh coat of wax before the snow flies can help protect against damage from salt and dirt.



Tires lose pressure as temperatures drop. Even if winter conditions are mild, remember to check your pressure once a month.

If driving where temperatures consistently approach freezing, consider a winter tire like the Michelin X-Ice Xi3, built for superior traction and handling in winter conditions.

INSIDE



BATTERY

Battery capacity is decreased significantly by cold weather. Before the winter months, have your mechanic check it to ensure it's at peak performance.



HEATER AND DEFROSTER

Make sure the heater and defroster are in proper working condition for occupant comfort and visibility.



INTERIOR MATS

Use winter mats to protect your car's interior from winter mud and snow.



EMERGENCY KIT

Carry an emergency kit with gloves, blanket, flares, a shovel, flashlight, water, extra batteries and cell phone charger.

SMART START

Let your car idle for a few minutes before driving in cool temps and give your engine a chance to warm up for optimal performance. Bonus for those with remote start!





Is No Homework the Way to Go?

second-grade teacher from
Texas recently made headlines
after she sent home a note to
parents, informing them that
their students' homework would only
consist of materials they did not finish in
class that day. Instead, she encouraged
families to spend more time together
rather than spend hours on homework. So,
what is the role of homework, and are kids
getting too much?

As a former teacher and current educational consultant, I was recently asked for my reaction to this "no homework" approach, and wanted to share my thoughts.

This story has a lot of people talking. Do you think more teachers should adopt this "no homework" rule for their classrooms?

Homework is an area of stress and tension in almost every household.
Unfortunately, some kids get so stressed and overwhelmed by homework, leaving them almost no time to enjoy being a kid.
And when it creates too much stress, the parent/child relationship becomes all about academic performance.

The general rule of thumb when it comes to homework is about 10 minutes of homework per grade level per night. So, while this story may sound peculiar, it's actually following the guidelines for a second grader.

Does homework really help kids become better students?

Homework truly helps when kids are efficient, organized and know how to find answers when they are stuck. But when kids don't have a plan and don't fully understand the subject matter, the

amount of time it takes them to finish the work grows exponentially. Kids end up either spending far too much time working inefficiently, or they spend no time at all because they're overwhelmed, unprepared and convinced they're going to fail. Instead of trying, they would rather pretend like they don't care.

Current research shows that homework for students younger than fifth grade is not beneficial. It doesn't help them to be smarter or score better on tests. For older kids, about 90 minutes of homework is a perfect amount of time; anything more

becomes redundant. However, parents at high-performing high schools across the country are seeing their kids working on homework for up to 3 hours each night.


What about teaching responsibility? Does homework help with this?

It depends on the student. If the student has a system for planning, organizing and completing assignments, then homework is an amazingly powerful tool. It's not just about being responsible with homework, it's also about packing up materials the night before and following a consistent process. And when parents help with that, they're reinforcing the right types of behaviors.

Being in the competitive Washington, D.C. area, it is inevitable that your student will get homework. What are things parents can do to help their kids with homework?

First, understand your child's situation,

because one size does not fit all. So if your child is bright but disorganized, and lacks organization and planning, it's necessary to set up structure in the home from the start of the school year.



Sometimes kids have subject struggles and get just a tad bit behind, causing them to lose confidence, which can trigger a downward spiral. If it's caught early enough, and they know there is a support system available to help, they can overcome the hurdle. This can boost their confidence because they see they can conquer a challenge.

A growing number of kids are stressed from studying. And without the right strategies, these conscientious kids can expend more time and energy than they might need. The key for these kids is to not get overwhelmed early on and always plan ahead.







In order to create optimal skin, you need to keep hydrating and moisturizing from the inside out, which can do a lot to keep your skin comfortable and elastic during cold winter months. Here's how:

- **1. Omega-3 Fats:** Omega-3 fats are excellent for overall cardiac and joint health, but did you know that they could also zap dry skin woes as well? Omega-3's can restore significant oil and comfort to the skin. Good food sources are salmon, sardines, walnuts and flaxseed. You can also take a daily supplement of 1,000 to 3,000 milligrams.
- **2. Water:** Our bodies need a constant supply of fresh water to stay well hydrated and support all of our organs, especially our skin. Internal dehydration is one of the main causes of dry skin, so make sure you are drinking the right amount of water. In general, minimum intake should be 1 gallon of water per day. Some researchers recommend more if you are sweating from exercise or other conditions; 91 ounces per day for women and 107 ounces for men.
- **3. Vitamin C:** Vitamin C is a "skin health" vitamin. It helps build collagen in the skin that keeps the skin tight yet elastic. Good sources are citrus fruits, but you should also include a high-potency Vitamin C supplement of about 1,000 to 2,000 milligrams a day.
- **4. Vitamin A:** Vitamin A deficiency can result in dry skin, especially in winter. Make sure you are getting enough beta carotene (the precursor from which your body makes its own Vitamin A) in yellow vegetables and fruits such as squash, cantaloupe and carrots. Make sure your daily supplement contains beta carotene as well.
- 5. Vitamin D: This amazing workhorse vitamin does a lot for optimal health. It also helps to create healthy skin and prevent and cure dry skin, even psoriasis. Especially in the winter months, we do not get enough sunlight exposure to give us adequate Vitamin D. If you have chronic dry skin that gets worse in winter, you might be deficient in Vitamin D. It also helps process Vitamin A and C, the other skin health vitamins. A Vitamin D deficiency can be determined by a simple blood test. Meanwhile, a minimum of 1,000-2,000 milligrams of Vitamin D3 a day will remedy this. If you are over age 50, and do not drink D-fortified dairy products, you may need even more (up to 5,000 milligrams a day).

MOISTURIZERS AND OTHER SKIN COMFORT TIPS


You don't have to invest in expensive moisturizers to help remedy dry, itchy winter skin. Your corner pharmacy likely has a good stock of different brands of inexpensive skin moisturizers you can use on your entire body. Here's what to look for:


- 1. Oil-based Products: Look for a primarily oil-based product for winter use as opposed to water based, which work better in spring and summer months. Don't forget the old staples of baby oil or baby lotion. These work as well as more expensive "beauty products" marketed for dry skin.
- **2. Moisture Attractors:** If you want to invest in some of the more high-end products, look for ones that contain "humectants" like sorbital, alpha-hydroxy acids or glycerine that help keep moisture in the skin. Make your winter soap one with olive oil or glycerine that won't dry it.
- 3. Kitchen/Medicine Chest Remedies: You can make your own inexpensive, excellent skin moisturizers using a few natural products you may already have in your kitchen or bathroom cabinet. Some of my favorites are extra virgin olive oil, sunflower oil, mineral oil and glycerine. You may want to refrigerate a bit of the oil for your specific skin use, which not only helps keep the oils fresh, but the coolness also feels great on your skin.
- **4. Lukewarm Bath:** Though a hot bath may sound good after being out in the cold, a lukewarm water bath is better for your skin. Adding some baby oil and/or colloidal oatmeal (available at most pharmacies) or glycerine to it can also help overly dry skin. Use a moisturizer after your bath to lock water against the skin.

5. Add a Humidifier: If your furnace is compatible, add on a humidifier. It's well worth the extra expense to keep your home comfortable with a good moisture level. Or, you can place small electric humidifiers throughout your house. It's important to increase the comfort levels in bedrooms and living rooms — the places you spend the most time.

Even though dry, itchy, chapped skin can be uncomfortable, take heart. You can banish winter skin! With these simple and inexpensive remedies, you'll find your winter skin becomes a whole lot easier to live in.






